

From the handicappers

Match Committee and the handicappers wish to thank members for their perseverance and patience in familiarising themselves with the new system for registration for competitions through the computer. A few teething problems, especially the computer's recent breakdown, have made life difficult for all of us but we will get there.

A few tips to help members through this transition period.

- 1. If you are having difficulty getting the system to accept your Golflink card, please do not attempt to use the keyboard. For the time being, it will be acceptable for you to enter by writing your name on the competition sheet. The handicappers will lodge your entry into the computer for you. The club committee has approved the purchase of a touch screen which will simplify the registration process for everyone.
- 2. Handicaps can be checked from the yellow folder on the competition room bench. An up to date printout of all current handicaps should be available at all times.
- 3. If you do register by swiping your Golflink card, note that your **exact** handicap will be displayed. This sometimes needs to be rounded up to your **playing** handicap e.g 13.7 exact becomes a playing handicap of 14. If in doubt, check your handicap in the yellow folder.
- 4. Result printouts on the noticeboard are now in a different format. Saturday results no longer have separate sheets for A, B and C grades. New handicaps are shown only for players who have had changes to their playing handicaps, and are shown in bold type in a column under the heading 'New'.

A recipe from Brian Cullen

Sawardee (สวัสดี) – A recipe from Brian Cullen

We recently returned from a fantastic holiday in Kata Beach, Thailand, where Tay (wife of Bob Hopgood – aka Papa Bob with four fingers) organized a Thai cooking lesson for me with the Phuket Thai Cookery School. While we may enjoy (or not) the fare provided by Melbourne Thai restaurants, the course did point out a number of differences between our restaurants and the genuine article. Apart from available ingredients, the most glaring difference would be that in Thailand, most often it is the coriander root and stem that is used in the recipe with the leaves merely used as garnish. The flavor is far more subtle.

Kaeng Kiew Wan Kai is one of our favorite dishes from the course. Translation is Green Curry with Chicken. It is a soup, not a main course. However, with a very few minor additions to the original recipe (as provided) I also offer you a main meal version that loses nothing in flavor! Serves two.

Soup	Ingredients	<u> Main Meal</u>
1 tbsp / 15 mls	Vegetable oil	1 tbsp / 15 mls
2 tbsp / 50 g	Green curry paste	2 tbsp / 50 g
400 mls can	Coconut cream	400 mls can
1 cup / 225ml	Chicken stock	1 cup / 225ml
3/4 cup / 150 g	Chicken breast, thinly sliced (I prefer thigh fillet)	250 g
2 ea	Thai eggplant, trimmed cut into quarters (1)	4 ea
½ cup / 50 g	Pea eggplant (substitute zucchini if not available)	1 cup / 100 g
(not in recipe)	Zucchini, diced similar size to eggplant pieces	½ ea
2 ea	Kaffir lime leaves, remove stem, shredded (I'll leave some in the RGC fridge)

1 tbsp / 30 mls	Fish sauce	1 tbsp / 30 mls
1 tbsp / 20 g	Palm sugar (substitute ½ honey, ½ water)	1 tbsp / 20 g

Note 2: The Chinese grocer in Mitcham usually has all these ingredients A tbsp in Thai cooking can be anywhere from 15 mls to 30 mls - use metric measures.

Procedure:

- 1. Prepare all ingredients and have them at hand. (4)
- 2. Heat the oil in the wok. Add curry paste and fry over low to medium heat, stirring regularly to prevent the paste burning, about 1-2 minutes.
- Add coconut cream and stock, bring back to boil. Add chicken and simmer until tender, about 1-2 minutes. Bring back to boil and add eggplant and zucchini and continue to cook for 1 minute.
- 4. Season with fish sauce and sugar and simmer about 1-2 minutes.
- 5. Sprinkle with about ¾ of the kaffir lime leaves, chili and basil leaves (retain the remainder for garnish) and continue to cook for another 30 seconds. Remove from heat.
- For soup use a smaller bowl to serve. For main meal use a larger flat bowl

 place half the cooked rice to the side of each bowl, spoon the curry into the bowls and sprinkle with the garnish.
