

The other big difference is that for the next three years we will be supporting two new charities.

1. St Vincent De Paul Community Services

St Vincent De Paul is a not for profit organisation established over 50 years ago. They operate a range of accommodation and support initiatives for people who experience homelessness; providing help with issues such as general health concerns, drug and alcohol abuse, employment education and training options, and social exclusion and isolation. Their Community Service participants are often the most disadvantaged and marginalised citizens in our communities, and present to us with complex issues that often require long-term strategies and involvement.

2. Eastern Volunteers

Eastern Volunteer Resource Centre Inc. (Eastern Volunteers) is a not-for-profit community service organisation that was established in 1976 and which provides volunteer-assisted transport services and volunteer recruitment, referral and training services across the municipalities of Maroondah, Whitehorse and Yarra Ranges. Other projects and services are provided across the broader Eastern Metropolitan Region.

Eastern Volunteers is a Public Benevolent Institution endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to access income tax exemption; GST concessions; FBT exemption and has certification as a Deductible Gift Recipient.

DRESS CODE

Please take note of the Ringwood Golf Club's dress code on competition days. We have the Dress Code guide lines up just inside the front door if you are unsure. It is important that we maintain a good standard of dress both on and off the course. If you see a member that is not dressed in the accepted attire please alert a committee member so we can take an appropriate course of action.

Am I out of bounds?

There have been a couple of incidents recently around Out of Bounds particularly on the 8th and 17th holes. The definition of Out Of Bound is:

"Out of bounds" is beyond the boundaries of the course or any part of the course so marked by the Committee.

When out of bounds is defined by reference to stakes or a fence or as being beyond stakes or a fence, the out of bounds line is determined by the nearest inside points at ground level of the stakes or fence posts (excluding angled supports). When both stakes and lines are used to indicate out of bounds, the stakes identify out of bounds and the lines define out of bounds.

When out of bounds is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is out of bounds. The out of bounds line extends vertically upwards and downwards.

A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. A player may stand out of bounds to play a ball lying within bounds.

Objects defining out of bounds such as walls, fences, stakes and railings are not obstructions and are deemed to be fixed. Stakes identifying out of bounds are not obstructions and are deemed to be fixed.

Note 1: Stakes or lines used to define out of bounds should be white.

A few points to note come out of this definition:

- The line on the ground or the 'imaginary' line between stakes defines the out of bounds in the absence of a fence. The ball must be completely outside that line to be OOB. This means that on the 8th hole, a ball coming to rest inside the line of the stakes, even if it is against the logs defining the left hand side of the path, is still inbounds if inside the line of the stakes, as the stakes define the OOB.
- On the 17th hole, past where the fence defines the boundary (i.e. about >100m off the tee), the stakes are intended to define the line of the old garden bed as being the boundary for out of bounds. At the time of printing a local rule had been implemented to define the edge of the old garden bed as the boundary to grant lee-way to the player technically outside the line of stakes, but on the grass in the 'tongues' that protrude towards the fence. This is not satisfactory in the long term but we feel is commonsense until either more stakes can be put in place or a line painted onto the grass to define the OOB.
- Please note the 'should' in Note 1 the Match Committee may ultimately determine the boundary as long as it is clearly communicated yes it 'should' be defined with white stakes or lines, but the reality is that we do not have control over the course so may need to make a decision from time to time in this regard and would appreciate constructive criticism in these instances.
- Lastly, we do NOT have a local rule defining OOB stakes as movable obstructions, so they are part of the boundary and if your swing or stance is interfered with you must play the ball as it lies.

If you find your ball is out of bounds, and if you haven't played a provisional, under stroke and distance you must go back to where you played your last shot—so the take home message is if in doubt play a provisional ball!
