

Golf tips - Ben Boyd Changes to the Rules of Golf

Can I declare my ball lost?

This one came up during the recent Club Championships.

Under **Rule 27** a player cannot declare their ball lost by declaration. A ball can only be considered lost when:

- a. It is not found or identified by the player within five minutes after the player's side or his or their caddies have begun to search for it; or
- b. The player has made a stroke at a provisional ball from the place where the original ball is likely to be or from a point nearer the hole than that place (See Rule 27-2b); or
- c. The player has put another ball into play under penalty of stroke and distance under Rule 26 1-a, 27-1 or 28a; or
- d. The player has put another ball into play because it is known or virtually certain that the ball, which has not been found, has been moved by an outside agency (Rule 18-1), is in an obstruction (Rule 24-3), is in an abnormal ground condition (see Rule 25-1c) or is in a water hazard (see Rule 26-1b or c); or
- e. The player has made a stroke at a substituted ball.

Repairing divots

Players are asked to keep in mind the players following them when repairing divots.

It is great that we have a growing culture of care for the course. The aim of filling divots is **not** to make the grass grow faster (many high levels courses do not allow players to fill divots as it inhibits regrowth) but to reduce the likelihood of a following player's ball coming to rest in the divot depression. To most effectively achieve this, the divot should only be filled with enough sand that it is level or just proud of the surrounding ground. Emptying half a bucket into a divot without spreading it out acts as a minibunker trapping the ball rather than allowing it to run over onto a fresh piece of fairway.

Entering the competition and completing cards

The Match Committee would like to thank all players for their cooperation in putting membership numbers and marker names onto their cards – it makes a big difference to the time the handicappers spend compiling the results and getting out results, especially on a Saturday. The number of players not registering via computer has pretty much gone to zero, so the system is working well, but please keep up your vigilance to avoid unnecessary DQs!

What is a garden bed?

Please keep in mind the overall philosophy of the rules of golf: "Play the ball as it lies, play the course as you find it" so the default position is that you are not in a garden bed, and that garden beds are only for ornamental reasons or to protect young foliage. The Garden Beds are clearly defined on the A-frame board in the clubrooms near the middle exit door.

Trivia Night – 21st July, 2012.


'Fame Trivia' (An Oz-wide company presenting 120 shows a week) will be presenting the night as our usual presenter is unavailable for our preferred dates.

From the Pro Shop

Another busy and successful summer season is now behind us, and the days are already shortening noticeably. The course held up really well again throughout summer this year and course improvements continue.

Fairway improvement update

Work is in progress on the development of a storm water "harvesting" system located along the right hand side of the 4^{th} Fairway. The end result will be the creation of a wetland with a series of pits that will collect or "harvest" storm water generated by rainfall. The water collected in this wetlands area will eventually be pumped to the main irrigation dam adjacent to the 16^{th} hole.

The final stage of this development will be the installation of a new pumping system and transfer line – this will be located on the right hand side of the 4^{th} fairway, and the transfer line will run from the pump across the 4^{th} , 5^{th} , 6^{th} , 2^{nd} . 11^{th} and 17^{th} fairways into the new dam.

We anticipate that the transfer line and pumping system will be all completed in time for the irrigation season.

The fill generated from the excavation of the wetland is being utilized to enhance the area between the 1st and 10th greens – we are constructing a series of mounds and building a new pathway from the 1st green to the 2nd tee.

All players will have noticed that the 12th tee has been reconstructed. The tee area has been substantially increased by some 200 sq metres and will be a lot easier to maintain in top condition. In addition, the pathway alongside the 12th tee has been concreted and we hope to extend this concreted pathway in the near future.

We would also like to thank Bernie Van Blaricum for his barbeque skills.


A big thanks to the ladies who made salads for lunch and thanks to Midori and Kiego Nakijima for the sushi they provided a very special treat
