
## From the President






## Jean Rutherford - 1927 - 2014

Jean passed away peacefully on 25 July 2014. Jean is credited with being the catalyst to forming a ladies division within the Ringwood Golf Club, by writing to the local paper in 1971, requesting ladies interested in playing golf to attend a meeting at the Ringwood library.

The club did eventuate, and Jean became the first Vice President under President Betty Breakwell. She subsequently became President in 1974 for 3 years, then served on committee, as Secretary, Vice President again - then from 2006/10, conducted the charity stall each "Medal Day".



## Bev Bailey - 1934 - 2014

Bev Bailey sadly passed away on 21st May 2014, aged 79 years. Bev joined the club in July 2001 after resigning from Box Hill Golf Club. She was very involved in the club, and was a very willing and capable helper on function days in the catering department. ## Rules of Golf 2012-15: Rule 14-2b Page 67

#### Positioning of Caddie or Partner behind Ball

A player must not make a stroke with his caddie, his partner or his partners caddie positioned on or close to an extension on or close to an extension of the line of play of put behind the ball.

Exception There is no penalty if the players caddie or partner is inadvertently located on or close to an extension of the line of play or line of putt behind the ball.

PENALTY MATCH PLAY; LOSS OF HOLE. STROKE PLAY – 2 STROKES.


From **Decisions of Golf 2011- 2011 R30-3f/13:** 

#### Partner Stands of Extension of Players Line of Play Behind Ball

Q A and are partners in a 4 ball completion. A's ball is on the putting green 30 feet from the hole, and B's ball is 20 feet from the hole on a similar line. To assist him with his own putt, B stands on an extension of the line of put behind A's ball while A puts. What is the ruling?

A A was in breach of Rule 24-2b by allowing his partner B to position himself on or close to an extension of the line while he made his stroke. As A's breach assisted B, B also incurred the same penalty (Rules 30-3f 31-8).

PENALTY MATCH PLAY; LOSS OF HOLE. STROKE PLAY – 2 STROKES.



Googled: No one on a player's "team" (partner, caddie, or partner's caddie) is permitted to stand behind the player on an extension of the line of play (or putt) behind the ball while the player is making a stroke [Rule 14-2b]. The reason is that positioning someone behind you might assist you in lining up your shot. If you watch golf tournaments, you will notice the caddie line up the player and then move aside before the player hits the ball. If you need help watching your shot, your partner should be able follow the flight of your ball from the side. If you allow him to stand behind you (to the right of a right-handed golfer), it will cost you two strokes (loss of hole in match play).

If your partner is inadvertently standing on the other side of the hole while you putt, there is no penalty [Rule 14-2, Exception]. However, if he stands there and says: "Aim at my left toe," you're looking at a two stroke/loss of hole penalty for a breach of Rule 8-2b, which prohibits touching the green to point out a line for putting. Your partner may point out a line (without touching the green), but he may not be a target.

Your partner may, of course, attend the flagstick for you.
