Keeping You Updated

Competition Suspension

As you are now aware through previous communication, Competition Golf at our Club is on hold for an indefinite period. In view of this, the following steps have been taken:

- 1. The current syllabus is now not applicable. A new syllabus will be drafted once we know when Competition will resume.
- As the duration of this situation is unknown, it may be necessary to cancel some Major Competitions this year.
- 3. Major Competitions which are currently partially completed are suspended and we hope that we will be able to complete these later in the year.
- 4. Online bookings have now ceased.
- 5. All existing prizes will remain in the system. There will be no automatic purging after 12 months.

We still have 10 x Major Saturday Competitions left to play this year with several of these played over multiple rounds. There are also 5 x Thursday Ladies, and 2 x Wednesday Mens Major Competitions left to play or complete with some of these also over multiple rounds.

With no idea yet, but the prospect of at least a few months without Competition, it seems inevitable that some of our Major Competitions will need to be abandoned or modified this year.

Once we know when we can resume Competitions, we will provide a new syllabus as quickly as possible.



- Who am I? Born in Altanta, Georgia on March 17, 1902. My father was a Colonel in the Army and also a Lawyer. I battled health issues as a boy and was introduced to Golf as a strengthening tool for my body. I took to golf like a duck to water and won my first amateur tournament at 6 yrs of age. I am most famous for winning the unique "Grand Slam", victory in all four major golf tournaments (the open and amateur championships in both the US and UK) in a single calendar year (1930). During my career I played mostly as an amateur, competing in 31 majors, winning 13 before I retired in 1930 at age 28. After competitive golf, I founded and helped design the Augusta National Golf Club and co-founded the Masters Tournament. I also co-developed the first set of matched steel-shafted clubs. To this day, they are still considered one of the best-designed sets ever made. I battled health issues again later in life with Syringomyelia confining me to a wheelchair. I passed away on December 18, 1971 aged 69.
