Treasurer Report



Just a short report to inform Members of our proposed Income and Expenditure up to the end of our Financial Year (30/06/2023)

At this stage as of the 31st March 2023 we have about \$27,000. In our cash Accounts.

Hopefully that this will see us through without touching our Term Deposits.

For the remaining 3 months I expect an income of approximately \$25,500 made up of Competition Fees and Bar Income.

And that the expenditure to be about \$ 24,000. The income made up of Bar income and Comp Fees – the expenses made up of Outstanding accounts, Bar Purchases, Bar Fees and Cleaning. Also included are the Pennant Costs, Green Fees.

One of the biggest expenditures will be the Vouchers and Balls owing to Club Members. This amount approximately \$10,000 is not included in the above figures.

I encourage all Members after their rounds, come into the Clubhouse and support the bar. The more that the bar takes helps to keep the cash flow to pay Accounts. Also, they would be entered into the Members draw (Saturday only) for a \$40 voucher.

It would be also nice if Members who have outstanding vouchers and Balls, please collect them as soon as possible prior to the 30th June 2023.
