Committee Report

The work necessary to review the booking system with a view to reinstate members a permanent tee-time is ongoing and a small working group is hoping to make a recommendation to the RGC Committee soon. Members will be consulted soon and then hopefully a new system will be introduced in early 2024 as the work required is considerable.

Maroondah Councill will at its next meeting consider the **Maroondah Golf – Annual State of Play Report**. Some of the key take aways from this report are:

- A record financial result for MCC (Ringwood & Dorset)
- An operational surplus of \$1.155M not including capital expenditure of \$464K
- A net financial result of \$691K
- On average, Ringwood hosted 257 players every day
- At peak times, the demand for tee-times is often 50% greater than the tee-times available
- In 2022-23, Ringwood recorded 93,242 visits; the best attendance since 1997-98!
- Golfing facilities are ageing and at capacity and an exploration of future opportunities will commence in the 12 months ahead
- Maroondah Golf to implement Golf Australia programs (& other initiatives) to target underrepresented groups (females & juniors in particular)
- Golf clinic participation has grown by 68% in 2022-23 equating to over 4000 participants
- Feedback from golf course user groups has been around groups requesting additional allocated tee-times but Council believes that current allocations achieve a good balance

Our **Annual General Meeting** is scheduled for Tuesday 19th Sept @ 7:30pm at the RGC Clubrooms. This is a key event for our Club, and I am hoping that this meeting will be well attended in a show of member support for your committee. Committee members currently filling positions up for election have renominated which sends an encouraging message but of course further nominations are always welcome.

Speaking of key events, our **Presentation Day** will be a lunch time event on Sunday 26th November @ The Knox Club. Please put this in your calendar. It is my sincere hope that members will support the event with their attendance and help recreate a fun day on what is a prestigious event to recognize the winners of all the competitions throughout the year.

I look forward to seeing you at both the AGM & Presentation Day.

RGC Junior Program

We are working towards re-establishing a junior program for boys and girls. Hopefully many of these young people will decide to become members of our Club. This is not about RGC conducting clinics rather we are seeking to link with Maroondah Leisure and offer a pathway for boys and girls who graduate from the golf clinics conducted by Darren Rowland. Maroondah Leisure have agreed to register all participants as a "golf mate" (see Golf Australia website) and provide \$5.00 golf rounds.

Essentially, our proposal will be a 12-week program where participants play a weekly 9 holes of golf and be accompanied by a Club member who might caddie only or play with the learner.

The Club has established two sponsorship Officers, Des Pinfold and Russell Stanfield, who have volunteered their time (and efforts) to arrange sponsorship agreements to support this initiative.

The objective of our proposed program is to provide the opportunity for participants to learn from our Club buddy, the Rules of Golf and the required etiquette. When these learners achieve a satisfactory level of competence, introduce them to competition golf and RGC membership.

This is the perfect opportunity to volunteer your time and support your Club.

Golf Rules Answers

- 1. False A ball is in a bunker when any part of the ball touches sand on the ground inside the edge of the bunker, or is inside the edge of the bunker and rests:
- On ground where sand normally would be (such as where sand was blown or washed away by wind or water), or
- In or on a loose impediment, movable obstruction, abnormal course condition or integral object that touches sand in the bunker or is on ground where sand normally would be.
- 2. False In four-ball, when a player gets a penalty other than disqualification, that penalty normally applies only to the player and not also to their partner. In match play, a player who gets the general penalty (loss of hole) has no score that can count for the side on that hole; but this penalty has no effect on the partner, who may continue to play for the side on that hole. In this case, Marcela's ball has been hit as a wrong ball and she must either replace the original ball or another ball on the original spot (which if not known must be estimated).
- 3. False You are only entitled to free relief from an embedded ball when your ball lies in the general area. There is no relief under this Rule if the ball is embedded anywhere except in the general area. However, if the ball is embedded on the putting green, the player may mark the spot of the ball and lift and clean the ball, repair the damage caused by the ball's impact, and replace the ball on its original spot.
