# Work in Progress – Potential re instatement of Permanent Tee-Times

The RGC Committee has via a working group over a significant period of time, undertaken a review of the tee times and the booking system to determine if there is a better system that makes it easier to:

- 1. guarantee each member at least 1 game a week on their preferred day of play and preferred time range, and
- 2. maximise the use of the allocated tee times provided by Maroondah Council (minimise late cancellations that cannot be filled by other members)

The fastest internet connection or 'fastest finger first' is neither fair nor an efficient way to ensure all our members can rely on their RGC membership providing at least one game of golf every week.

The RGC Committee working group have analysed member playing behaviour (*MiClub bookings, cancellations, no-shows*) over an 18-month period and reviewed options available in the MiClub system.

Focus group meetings and Match committee meetings have also been held to assist in the development of the most appropriate solution to the (2) objectives outlined above and eliminating the 'fastest finger' problem.

When and if processes and procedures that address Focus and Match committee meeting feedback are resolved, it is envisaged that members will be required to complete a questionnaire that will ask:

- if they want a permanent tee time
- if so, on which day of play and a preferred time range
- if they are happy to play with a set group of members or they wish to play with a variety of members

Documentation such as updated Rules and procedures, no show policy, cancellation policy would be made available to all members via email and in hard copy in the Clubhouse to assist members in making appropriate decisions to complete the questionnaire.

At this stage a definitive solution to address the (2) objectives has not been finalised. If and when a solution is available, the appropriate update to members will be provided.

# **Captain's Corner**

Hi all,

It's time for another Captain's Corner, everyone's favourite irregular update from the Captain to cover match news, FAQs, and provide updates about the club. So, without further ado I'll get into it.

#### **Pennant Update**

The Pennant season is fast approaching once again, and sign-up sheets have now gone up on the notice boards.

We will once again have one scratch side, two handicap sides, and two seniors' sides, and we are pleased to announce that this year Ringwood will be competing in the inaugural season of VGL mixed pennant.



The Women's pennant team submissions close 31<sup>st</sup> January, please contact Corinne Dyer and place your name on the list on the board in the comp room. You must have played a minimum of 3 games for the season with a handicap limit of GA 39.0

Dates for all sides are available on the VGL website.

#### Match Play Walkover Policy

The club's new Match Play Walkover policy is now in effect, and the full policy is available in the Syllabus Information and Rulings document.

We have noticed a rise in the number of walkovers being given in match play events in recent years, and, while the vast majority have a good reason behind them, we have implemented this policy with an aim to reduce the number of walkovers given in bad faith.

This covers things like holidays and events, where members would have been aware of their inability to play a match well in advance, and simply not showing up on the day.

The policy has been written to be intentionally broad so that each case can be treated individually on its merits and unforeseen scenarios can be handled as the match committee sees appropriate. For this reason, we have included a defined appeal process so that all members feel they are given a fair go.

Our hope is that we never have to exercise this policy and ask that all members give careful thought before qualifying for match play events. Dates for all major events are outlined in the Syllabus Fixture, both individually on the date of play and as a list at the end of the document.

#### **Inclement Weather Policy**

Also included in the Syllabus Information and Rulings document is the club's new Inclement Weather Policy.

We have made changes so that essentially the daily competition is never called off once it has begun. Provided that enough players complete their round (Section 9, Item 11) to constitute a daily competition then prizes and handicapping will occur as normal.

This change was made because the old policy gave a bias to players playing early, where if the weather was bad early the comp was called off even if it cleared later, while the opposite was not true. If the early players got good weather and the afternoon was unplayable the comp would still go ahead.

In the case of major events, if the course becomes unplayable at any point during the round, then the major event only will be postponed or cancelled as necessary. For example, if the course becomes unplayable during a round of the Club Championships, then the championships will be postponed but there will still be a daily Stroke competition.

Players will be notified of any major events being called off via text message and signs in the comp room. Never assume that an event is going to be called off, if there is any doubt, we recommend continuing your round or contacting myself (Corinne on Thursdays) for clarification.

#### **Saturday Medal Days**

There has been some confusion lately surrounding our two medal days on Saturday, so I'd like to clarify it for everyone.

There are two different types of medal days played throughout the year, with two different prize formats, they are as follows:

#### VGL Medals

There are eight VGL medal days played throughout the year. The format is nett stroke and the medal is awarded to the best score on the day, regardless of grade (Men only). The eight winners then play off in the Star Medalist event, with the winner required to represent the club at the VGL's Medal of Medalists event. These medals are supplied by the VGL and are the equivalent of Thursday's Monthly Medal events.

#### Monthly Medals

There are twelve monthly medal days throughout the year. The format is Stableford and medals are awarded to the winners of each grade, including women. There is no playoff for this event, and medals are supplied by the club only at the member's request.

#### **Procedure for Pre-Booking and Visitors**

All requests to be pre-booked into a competition, or to have a visitor play, are to be made to only the captain. If the Captain is unavailable, please contact the Vice-Captain, the handicapper does not have the authority to approve these requests.

Requests to be pre-booked will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.

Bringing visitors to our club is highly encouraged, however requests to play with a visitor will only be granted once all members have had ample opportunity to book a tee-time on the day in question.
